





APPLICATION PROCEDURE



Eligibility for Admission

A person holding F.Sc. (Pre-medical) with minimum unadjusted 60% marks from Pakistan or an equivalent qualification is eligible for admission. Candidates have to qualify entry test of University of Health Sciences or entry test of the respective Province for getting admission in Margalla College of Dentistry.

OR

Any examination of a foreign university, which in scope and standard is found equivalent to the Intermediate Premedical examination of Pakistan, will make the candidate eligible for admission. It is, however, the responsibility of candidates to clear their cases through the Inter-Board Chairmen Committee (IBCC), Islamabad for recognition and equivalence of their qualification. The equivalence certificate must preferably be attached with the Admission Form.

Eligibility Criteria For Admission Against Foreign Seats

No admission shall be given without an entry test or a SAT II Score of 550 marks in each Subject. Only those Pakistani

Students and foreigners who have obtained the required qualifications from abroad, shall be eligible for admission on the foreign seats and shall have to appear in the entry test or present to the University, the requisite SAT II score. The students who are residing abroad or who have acquired their qualifications from abroad shall be eligible for being considered for admission Provided they have done their F.Sc or equivalent qualifition with Biology and either physics on Mathmatics. A minimum Score of 550 in TOEFL or 5.5 in IELTS shall be required from the students who have obtained their qualifications from those institutions where the medium of instructions is not English. An alternative to TOEFL and IELTS is a certification by NUML Islamabad after a one year language course.

Entry Test

A candidate must appear in the entry test conducted by the University of Health Sciences, Lahore, for getting admission in the BDS First Year. For details visit: www.uhs.edu.pk. Candidates from other Provinces must submit the entry test result of their respective Provinces.

Interview

The students finally selected will be interviewed for personality and aptitude for the medical education. The quantum of marks of a candidate given by an examining authority, will be taken into consideration for working out the merit.

Age Limit

The age limit has been abolished for admission in MBBS/BDS by Pakistan Medical & Dental Council (PM&DC).

- NOC (in case of other Punjab Boards / Universities): Original
- Undertaking on Stamp Paper: Original as per given specimen
- Mental and Physical Fitness Certificate: Original
- Matriculation & Intermediate Mark sheets / Certificates After Admission: Original

General Policy

Initially, all admissions in MIHS are treated as provisional. Any candidate, whose particulars, certificates or any other documents submitted with the admission form, if found to be fabricated, false or fake after the verification from the respective examination boards/domains, will be struck off from the college rolls, even if the candidate has been admitted.

No show cause notice will be necessary for any action under this rule of admission. The candidate who fails to report for admission interview on the prescribed date, shall be considered to have forfeited his/her chance of admission in MCD / MIHS.

The students of other provinces of Pakistan can

also apply if they have appeared in the entrance test of their respective province and will provide the original result of the test. Previous year's entry test will not be accepted.

Any student, during his studies at MCD/MIHS, not following rules or found violating disciplinary rules will be dealt with as per the College's Red Book . This may culminate in expulsion from the college. All cases of expulsion will be processed by the College Principal and will be forwarded to the Chairman / Vice Chairman MIHS for final decision.

Furthermore, application forms and photocopies of the documents of non-admitted candidates will not be returned.

Note: There shall be no refund of any deposited fee to a student whose admission gets cancelled due to provision of fabricated, false or fake documents or if he/she decides to discontinue his/her studies at MIHS (due to any reason) or gets rusticated / expelled / removed from the college rolls.





Fee & Refund Policy

The fee shall be charged annually on year to year basis and at the beginning of each year; i.e, before commencement of classes. In case of delay, students will be liable to pay late fee surcharge which will be 2% for the first month & 5% per month for the next two month on the outstanding amount. Furthermore, continuous non-payment up-to 3 months from due date will not only make student liable to be struck-off from college rolls but also for cancellation of registrations accordingly. Besides this, no application will be entertained by any of the offices regarding fee concession, re-scheduling or on the mode of payment.

There shall be no extra tuition fee for supplementary exams, however, students repeating the year due to detention will be charged as per detention rules in vogue.

After admission, if any student wants to leave the institution (due to any reason) within two weeks after commencement of classes, there shall be a 100% refund of all the deposited fee except one time admission / processing fee. If the student decides to leave within one month of joining / commencement of classes, there shall be a 50% refund of all deposited fee but if the student leaves the institution after one month of commencement of classes, then there shall be no refund applicable.

Here it is also pertinent to mention that there shall be no refund of deposited fee applicable to any student whose admission gets cancelled due to provision of fabricated, false or fake documents & such a student will get rusticated / expelled from the college rolls with immediate effect.

- No person shall be enrolled at the Margalla Institute of Health Sciences, Islamabad except on the strict understanding that the candidate intends to obtain his/her professional qualification.
- Every student is required to attend punctually the required hours notified for lectures and practical classes. He/she must have 75% of total attendance in an academic year to be eligible to appear in the University examination.
- Students are required to maintain discipline at all times in the college and the hostel or during any other activity arranged/ conducted by the Institution.
- Display and distribution of political party's pamphlets or circulars etc in the college and hospital premises are strictly prohibited.
- All irregularities, neglect of duties and breach of discipline are to be brought to the notice of the Principal by the teachers under whom the student is working.
- Leave application must be submitted to the Principal in writing through respective class teacher.
- All the students will pay their tuition fee in advance every year, in case of delay will be liable to late fee charges which will be 5% per month.
- If a student fails in supplementary in any

- session and loses one year, will be liable to pay fee as mentioned in PM&DC statute.
- In all cases, the leave taken will be at the students' own risk as far as the percentage of attendance is concerned and even a medical certificate will not condone a deficiency in attendance.
- In case of absence, fine of (Rs. 350/-per/Rs 50 per Lecture will be charged. Forthere more, if a student continuosly remains absent (without leave) for a period of two weeks, will be dealt with as per rules and regulations mentioned in Red Book of the institution which may culminate in striking off the student from the college rolls & respective university will be informed accordingly for cancellation of registrations.
- Students are prohibited to address any petition directly to a higher authority/press or unauthorized person
- Students desirous of addressing the Principal by a letter must do so individually. Joint applications are inadmissible.
- Any student wishing to make representation on a subject has the right of direct access to the Principal during the college hours at the prescribed time.
- The Principal, Professors and other staff members are accessible at any time to listen to the difficulties and grievances of the students and shall always be prepared to help them.
- Non-payment of college hostel transportation dues within stipulated time may result in cancellation of admission.

Migration Rules

Migration during the programme is not allowed, however, it is permissible in certain cases as





per migration policy of the university on mutual migration basis. In such cases, the following rules are stringently observed:

- Migration is not permitted unless the student has passed his First Professional examination.
- After seeking NOC from the Principal to apply for migration, a migration processing fee of Rs. 25,000/- is to be deposited by the applicant along with his application irrespective of the final outcome.
- A student from another college must report for admission in the same class on reciprocal basis and give an undertaking to follow the fee rules. Only then the student desirous of migration to another college will be permitted to migrate.
- Migration will not be allowed unless the student has cleared all the college/hostel dues.
- Migration will not be allowed to a student who has been debarred from taking professional/ local examination or has been expelled or rusticated; as long as the punishment remains enforced.

The college authorities can amend the above quoted rules whenever deemed necessary to keep discipline, law and order in the institute and will not be challenged in any court of law.

Class Room Discipline

- When the teacher enters the classroom, the students will stand up and will remain standing till they are directed to sit or till the teacher takes his seat.
- No student is allowed to leave the classroom without permission of the teacher.
- Immediately after assembly of the class,

- the roll call shall be taken and absence will be marked. A student coming late in the classroom will be marked absent unless the teacher accepts his/her excuse.
- Misbehavior of a student shall at once be reported by the teacher to the Principal through the respective HOD, who will take action as deemed necessary.
- Students are not allowed to keep their cell phones switched "on" inside the classroom or where an organized academic activity is going on.

Examination Hall Discipline

- Students are not allowed to take textbooks, notes, bags or cell phones into the examination hall.
- Any student found infringing the examination rules or having recourse to unfair means may be debarred from the examination and the matter shall be dealt with according to the University Rules. In case of such happening in the class/terms tests, the matter shall be reported to the Principal who may refer this case to the College Disciplinary Committee.
- Late comers arriving at the examination hall more than 30 minutes after the start of the paper will not be allowed to sit in the examination.

Discipline In Hospital

- Every student is required to attend the clinical teaching and perform ward duties regularly at the notified time.
- Students attending the hospital are required to abide by the rules of the hospital administration, who may award any punishment to a student committing any offence in the hospital or for negligence in





carrying out the duties entrusted to him/her in the hospital. The punishment may amount to debar him/her from attending any or all departments of the hospital for a period up to three months or impose a fine up to Rs. 5000/- as considered appropriate.

- Every student is required to attend the clinical departments to fulfill the clinical quota as per UHS/PM&DC requirements.
- Student attending clinical department are liable to abide by the rules and regulations of the hospital administration.

Offences

Committing the following acts within the college, hospital or hostel premises will warrant a strict disciplinary action against the defaulters.

Submitting false evidence


- Stealing
- Willful destruction of equipment, furnishings. etc.
- Physical violence against other students, faculty members, staff or patients
- Ragging, fooling the students anywhere
- Use of prohibited drugs
- Possession of fire arms and crackers in the college or hostel campus
- Violation of basic human rights
- Organizing/creating civil disturbance
- Non-payment of tuition and other fees/dues
- Protracted absence without permission from lectures, clinical duties and the inability to cope with the curriculum
- Smoking within the college or hospital premises
- Displaying and disseminating partisan, political pamphlets, CDs or circulars etc anywhere.







Any student violating the discipline will be pertinently fined in addition to other disciplinary actions by the Proctorial Board. The board comprises of faculty members that keep an eye on college discipline. Proctors report to chief proctor in writing about violations. There are three categories of disciplinary violations that are fined as per regulations of the "RED BOOK"



Proctorial Board Red Book in printed form can be had separately.

Disciplinary Actions

For all such offences that occur in the college, hostels or hospital, the Principal, may at his discretion refer the case to the college disciplinary committee, which shall be appointed by the college management from time to time. This committee shall have the power to interview any student or a staff member and will send its recommendations to the Principal. After considering the recommendations of the college disciplinary committee, the Principal is empowered to take one or more of the following disciplinary actions depending upon severity of the offence (Apart from directing make well the loss/damage):

The students may be:

- Asked to render an apology, verbal or written. This will be placed on the student's record.
- Placed under observation for a period up to one year. If during this period, he fails to improve his conduct, he may be expelled from the college.
- Fined up to Rs. 500 to 5000/-
- Suspended from the college rolls for a period of up to two weeks at a time.
- Expelled from the college and expulsion notified to all other medical colleges and universities of Pakistan.
- The Principal is competent to remit fines and

punishment already imposed. The decision of the Principal in all cases will be final.



It is well-stocked library with the latest professional books



and journals covering all biomedical and clinical sciences. A digital library access is available for students which also has a dedicated link with Higher Education Commission (HEC) and has all the latest journals and periodicals.



Media Society

This society consists of handpicked students with natural talent in fields of media and communication.

The job of this society is to cover the events and happenings at MIHS and provide media support for university publications and data bank.

MIHS produces two publications; a quarterly newsletter (MIHS Chronicles) and a bilingual annual magazine (Healers/Al Shaafi) in order to promote the creative and communicative aspects of learning and provision of a platform for communication and presentation of ideas of students.

These publications are prepared and produced by the dedicated student editorial board under the guidance and encouragement of the experienced faculty editorial board.

Literary Society

Students are encouraged to join the educational society. In the periodic meeting of this literary society, topics of interest from latest professional journals and current literature are discussed by the students with participation from faculty members.

Anatomy Museum

Museum is located in the college building in the department of Anatomy. It can easily accommodate 50 students.

It includes models of international standard on human anatomy, embryology and histology, limbs, torso, head and neck, brain, eyes, ear, lungs, reproductive system and pelvis etc. There is unique model of the hand which very neatly shows both the arches and different tendons, pulleys, arteries, veins and nerves etc.







A model of the forearm is used to teach I/V injection. Models prepared by the students and staff of MIHS are the good addition.

One section of the museum exhibits embryology models, which are extremely useful for the demonstration to students. There are also more



than 100 natural human bones in the museum.

Pathology Museum

Numerous specimens are taken from the patients' bodies and are preserved in look-through containers for the training of students.







It remains open from 8:00 a.m to 3:00 p.m in winter except on Saturdays and Sundays.

Research Facility


The research facilities are available to the staff members, to promote research in their field of interest. The students in the final year are also encouraged and involved in different research projects. Plans are to start different research oriented projects in co-ordination with different research agencies such as USAID etc. Online collaboration will also be utilized for this purpose; with different International Medical Research Organizations and the eminent scientists in different fields of medical sciences.

Hostel for Students

Hostels are situated in Gulrez. These are beautiful buildings having spacious rooms with clean and airy atmosphere. Living rooms have double occupancy. Every student is provided with a bed, a study table, a chair and a cupboard. The Hostels have beautiful lawns/terraces for students to sit and relax. The Hostels have a common room. TV room and a dining room in addition to the living room. Each room is provided with the facility of attached bath. There is also a prayer room for the students where they perform their religious activities. The warden strictly supervises the messing system and cleanliness of hostels. In case of emergency, medical treatment is provided. Shopping trips for the students are arranged to different shopping places weekly under the supervision of the hostel warden. Telephone facility is also provided to the students in the hostel. Strict security measures for the girls hostel are insured and guards are available round the clock.

There is arrangement of games like Table Tennis

and Badminton for the students. No student can leave the hostel without prior permission from the hostel warden and submission of an application. Only the persons, mentioned by the parents or quardians of the students. in the application form, are allowed to visit the students. The hostel rules and regulations

Cafeteria

Margalla Dental Hospital is the teaching hospital of Margalla Institute of Health Sciences and is located at Quaid-e-Azam Avenue, Gulrez-3, Rawalpindi. This hospital consists of 7 Clinical departments and has more than 100 dental chairs. The well experienced and highly qualified teaching staff Margalla College of Dentistry started training FCPS in Orthodontics and Operative Dentistry since 2010, which have been approved by College of Physician



and Surgeons Pakistan. All latest basic scientific instruments and appliances have been made available in dental hospital for the clinical training of students using the most modern techniques.

Prosthodontic Department

Prosthodontics Department of MDH is equipped with state of the art facility. All kinds of procedures are carried out by competent Doctors, These include;

Crown & Bridge work

Traditional methods to replace a missing tooth or teeth include the fabrication of a bridge. To replace a missing tooth with a bridge, at least one tooth on either side of the space created by the missing tooth must be prepared for a crown.

Dental Implants

These fixtures are placed into the jawbone and allowed to heal until they are "integrated" into the bone. Dental implants may be used to replace one, many or all of a patient's teeth.

Dentures

When a patient no longer has any natural teeth, complete dentures are the traditional method to restore function and appearance. Many patients experience difficulty wearing conventional dentures because of poor stability and decreased chewing function. The use of dental implants to improve the stability and retention of dentures is becoming quite popular.

Veneers

Porcelain veneers are used to modify the shape and color of teeth. Veneers are thin shells of porcelain that are etched and then bonded to the enamel of the teeth.





Orthodontics Department

Orthodontic Department deals with a way of straightening or moving teeth, to improve the appearance of the teeth and how they work. It can also help to look after the long-term health of your teeth, gums and jaw joints, by spreading the biting pressure over all your teeth.

Many people have crowded or crooked teeth. Orthodontic treatment will straighten the teeth or move them into a better position. This can improve their appearance and the way the teeth bite together, while also making them easier to clean.

Following treatments are carried out at Margalla Dental Hospital.

Removable appliance

Simple treatment may be carried out with a removable brace (a plate that can be taken out to be

cleaned). It has delicate wires and springs attached, which move the teeth using gentle pressure.

Functional appliance

It is sometimes possible to change the way the jaws grow, using a functional brace. This works by using the power of your jaw muscles and can help with certain types of problem.

Fixed appliance/Braces







Often, teeth need to be guided more accurately which is not always possible by using removable braces. So fixed bracse are used. This has brackets and bands which are temporarily stuck to the teeth. A flexible wire joins all the brackets and allows the teeth to be moved. You can't take the appliance out yourself, so it is called a fixed appliance.

When treatment is finished the teeth need to be held in position for a time. This is called the 'retention' period, and the appliances that hold the teeth in place are called retainers.

The retainers hold newly straightened teeth in position while the surrounding gums and bone settle. The retainers can be removable or fixed, depending on the original problem.

Oral Surgery Department

Oral and maxillofacial surgery is to correct a wide spectrum of diseases, injuries and defects in the head, neck, face, jaws and the hard and soft tissues of the oral and maxillofacial region. It is a recognized international surgical specialty. An oral and maxillofacial surgeon is a regional specialist surgeon treating the entire craniomaxillofacial complex, consisting of the mouth, jaws, face, skull, as well as associated structures.

We know the prospect of any sort of oral surgery can be daunting. That is why we carefully explain the process to our patients and make sure they understand what will happen during the surgical procedure. We also give patients full pre-surgery and post-surgery instructions so they can be fully prepared.

Restorative Dentistry

Restorative Department provides comprehensive restorative dentistry for patients who suffer from common oral health problems that require necessary care. These techniques can overlap with cosmetic dentistry procedures as modern restorations are designed to look and feel natural or improve one's existing appearance..
